









The South Westminster BIDs have conducted some research with Portland Communications to find out what London's recovery might look like, so businesses can build an effective plan for moving out of lockdown.

In total, 1,059 members of the general population in the UK (aged 18+) and 1,086 Londoners (18+) were interviewed online with questions relating to travel to places of work and within the UK and London, along with appetite to return to retail, hospitality and leisure businesses.








28% of Londoners expect to go back to the office between April 12 and May 17, this increases to 54% by June 21, 82% by the end of August and 93% by the end of 2021

(414 office workers in London who intend to go back to the office when the stay at home order ends)










Return to the office

14% would ideally spend up to a quarter of their working week in the office, 31% would ideally spend between a quarter and half, 34% would ideally spend between half and three quarters and 17% would spend three quarters to their full working week in the office










Travelling into and around **London**

Besides seeing family and friends, **52%** of Londoners were most looking forward to going to restaurants when lockdown is lifted, while **51%** were most looking forward to going to non-essential shops










Travelling into and around **London**

36% of Londoners think they'll return to pre-COVID levels of going to pubs and restaurants by Summer 2021. This increases to **53%** by Autumn 2021, **66%** by Winter 2021 and **85%** by 2022





Between July and September, the likelihood for Londoners going to restaurants and nonessential shops in Central London **increases by almost a fifth if they are vaccinated** by then





Travel within the **UK**

43% of the British public think that they will return to normal travel activities within the UK by summer 2021. This increases to 59% by Autumn 2021, 71% by Winter 2021, and 96% by 2022










In the months after restrictions are lifted ondomestic travel, **71%** of the British public feel safe going on a 'staycation' within the UK









9% of the British public who are planning to take a 'staycation' this summer are most likely to go to London









27% of respondents said the biggest thing drawing them to a 'staycation' in London is nightlife, while 19% said seeing landmarks

(77 respondents who said they are most likely to go on a staycation to London this summer)











Travelling into and around **London**

In the 6 months before lockdown, **50%** of the British public visited Central London either a few times, monthly or weekly

In the 6 months after restrictions are lifted on domestic travel, **44%** of the British public are likely to go to London specifically









Travelling into and around **London**

40% of the British public are unlikely to go to London because they would prefer to go the countryside/beach, while **26%** are either worried about COVID or don't want to be in a city (370 respondents who are unlikely to go to London in the 6 months following lockdown)










Travelling into and around **London**

63% of Londoners are likely to go to restaurants if they have not been vaccinated between March and June, while **64%** are likely to go to non-essential shops

How likely Londoners are to go to restaurants rises by 15 percentage points if they have been vaccinated between March and June, while there is an increase of 14 percentage points for going to non-essential shops










Travelling into and around **London**

65% of Londoners said the thing they miss most about going into Central London is to eat out, while 43% miss non-essential shops and 28% miss going to public parks










Travelling into and around **London**

Over **50%** of Londoners feel safe taking public transport in all travel scenarios, whether this is for leisure or commuting during the week and at weekends











Return to the office

When the stay at home order ends,

76% of Londoners plan to return to their office (545 office workers in London)



39% of Londoners said it is likely the recent drop in COVID infections will encourage them to return to the Office (131 office workers who are unlikely or unsure about returning to the office)







26% of Londoners who don't want to return to their offices said they want to avoid using public transport and they have the ability to work more flexible hours at home









Return to the office

65% of Londoners said they intend to get a COVID-19 vaccine, but will return to the office before they've been vaccinated



Return to the **office**

70% of office workers said they will feel safe taking public transport

(414 office workers in London who intend to go back to the office when the stay at home order ends)










Return to the office

35% of office workers primary motivations for wanting to return to the office is the social environment/culture, while **34%** want to collaborate with co-workers (414 office workers in London who intend to go back to the office when the stay at home order ends)(131 office workers who are unlikely or unsure about returning to the office)









Return to the office

72% of Londoners intend to coordinate the days they go into the office with social activities, while 65% intend to coordinate with opportunities to go shopping and 63% with opportunities to eat out
